



I want to start flight training, what should I do now?

1. Contact Executive Air to set up an appointment with an instructor.
2. Go get a FAA flight physical. Ask for a 3rd class medical and a student pilot certificate. This has to be done by an FAA Authorized Medical Examiner (AME). Contact an Executive Air flight instructor for details.
3. Get a photocopy of your birth certificate and a photo ID (both sides) to bring to your instructor when you begin training.

These documents must be on file with your instructor before you begin your official flight training. It is part of a citizenship verification rule from the federal TSA.

Being a Pilot is one of the most exciting things in life.

Almost everybody can learn to pilot an airplane, similar to learning to drive a car. It is a step by step building process that is learned by doing, after instructor demonstration, and under coaching, supervision and practice.

Am I eligible to take flight training?

Federal Aviation Administration Requirements:

- Must be 16 years old to solo, 17 to get a private license.
- Read, Speak and Understand English
- Be able to prove U.S. citizenship
- Pass a basic physical

How long does it take?

The FAA requires a minimum of 40 hours total flight time to get a private license.

You can be flying by yourself solo after as little as 8 to 10 hours of instruction!

What is training like?

Training involves both flying and ground lessons that are meant to fit together in a step by step skill building process. Your ground school and flying lessons will be integrated to help you really understand the information. Lessons usually involve a pre-briefing and about 1 hour of flight. After the flight, you will have a post-briefing and your instructor will evaluate your performance, answer your questions and tell you what to expect on your next lesson. You and your instructor work hand in hand that best meets your schedule.

How often should I fly when taking lessons?

Students can fly as much or as little as their schedule allows, but should try to fly at least once a week, twice or three times works best for optimal student progress. Lessons are usually kept to about an hour per flight, you can do two or three lessons a day with a break between each.

What am I able to do after I get a private license?

After completion of your private pilot training and you are issued your private license, you are able to carry passengers, fly anywhere in the U.S. day or night, in fair weather, in light single aircraft.

Do I have to buy a plane?

No, most student pilots rent the aircraft they receive training in. After your training is complete, Executive Air Taxi's Cessna 172's are available for qualified pilots to rent anytime.

Can I try it first to see if I like it?

Absolutely! If you are interested in becoming a pilot, see the instructor to schedule a trial flight lesson in which you get to take the controls of the airplane!
